Week 1 - The children will be intorduced to this half term's model text called Steven Rigg which closely links to Oliver Twist and how he escapes the workhouse.

They will focus on how to include dialogue in their story making sure speech is accurately punctuated.

Week 5 - 6 - The children will complete research linked to Victorian workhouses and create an information text.

Maths

Week 1 & 2: The children will look at different ways to multiply two-digit and three-digit numbers by a one-

Week 3 & 4: Using practical resources and then progressing to formal written methods, the children will complete division calculations focusing on two-digit numbers divided by one-digit numbers.

Week 5 - 6: Once the children have practised multiplication and division, they will move onto solving problems involving multiplying and adding, including using the distributive law to multiply two-digit numbers by one digit, integer scaling problems and harder correspondence problems such as n objects are connected to m objects.

The chn will practise their rapid recall for multiplication tables up to 12×12 . The children will practise their rapid recall so that they can recall the above times tables in and out of order and use this knowledge to support them when learning different areas in Maths.

How are Jewish beliefs expressed in the home?

History

- In year 5, the children are going to learn about the mining history in Horden.
- Complete a heritage walk, where they will walk around the local area and identify human and physical features of Horden and their significance to the community.
- They will learn about Tommy Armstrong and his significance.

- Gymnastics-Acrobatic The chn will create and perform a paired sequence on floor, mats and apparatus that includes three basic acrobatic balances (a part-weight bearing balance, counter-tension and a counter-balance) and up to six other actions
