 Light - Why did Icarus fall from the sky? In this unit children will explore the differences between light sources and light reflectors, and will sort these into two groups. Describe how shadows are formed and will explore the relationship between light, objects and the formation of shadows. Use shadow play, they will explore the properties of materials that can cast shadows and use the scientific terms opaque, translucent and transparent to describe these materials. Children will demonstrate an understanding of the possible dangers to health that the Sun, as a strong source of light, holds for them and others. Working Scientifically, children will set up simple comparative and fair tests to compare materials, and they will make systematic and careful observations of shadows, measuring them and reporting on their findings.? 	Adobe Spark: Learners will become familiar with the terms 'text' and 'images' and understand that they can be used to communicate messages. They will use desktop publishing software and consider careful choices of font size, colour and type to edit and improve premade documents. Learners will be introduced to the terms 'templates', 'orientation', and 'placeholders' and begin to understand how these can support them in making their own template for a magazine front cover. The will start to add text and images to create their own pieces of wor using desktop publishing software. Learners will look at a range of page layouts thinking carefully about the purpose of these and evaluate how and why desktop publishing is used in the real world. The suggested application for this unit is Adobe Spark. To use Spaccounts are needed for learners. A guide to creating accounts is provided in lesson 2.
