We have submitted plans for 3 exciting projects for next year:

- The '**Never Have I Ever**' project aims to provide a range of experiences, opportunities and activities that the children have not yet had the chance to try.
- '**Ride to Thrive**' aims to ensure that every child has the opportunity to learn to ride a bike by providing access to bicycles, equipment and coaching where needed.
- The '**Regulation Station**' is an inclusive wellbeing space designed to provide all pupils with access to a calm, supportive environment whenever they need time to regulate their emotions, reduce sensory overload or prepare themselves for learning.

Finally, on behalf of everyone at school, I would like to thank you for the lovely messages, generous gifts and beautiful cards we have received. Most importantly, thank you for recognising and appreciating the hard work of our staff. Your continued support throughout the year genuinely means a great deal to us all.
